CoVid-19 UPDATE

For the safety of our guests and volunteers, we have suspended our rotational shelter during this public health crisis and are providing shelter in hotels and giving guests funds to purchase food. We continue to provide 'wrap-around' services including case management and budgeting, as well as transportation to and from hotels and to childcare providers and work on a daily basis, as well as for medical appointments, social service agencies and apartment hunting; and a fuel subsidy and vehicle maintenance for those who have their own vehicles. We continue to work diligently to secure permanent housing for our guests. Once we are given the all-clear by state and federal officials, we will resume a modified version of our rotational shelter program.
